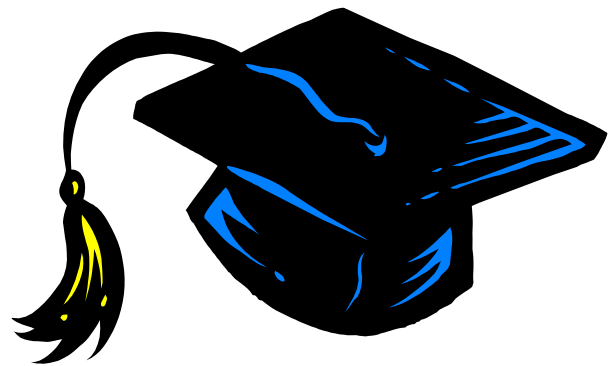

In time, Barry will need to get all his nutrition from a feeding tube as he will no longer be able to swallow. Eventually he will be using a wheelchair and speak through a computer because he will not be able to enunciate clearly.

While the road ahead seems difficult and discouraging, both Barry and Eunice continue to draw daily strength from God's gracious promise, *Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you* (Hebrews 13:5). They also appreciate the prayers and support they are receiving from their brothers and sisters in Christ.

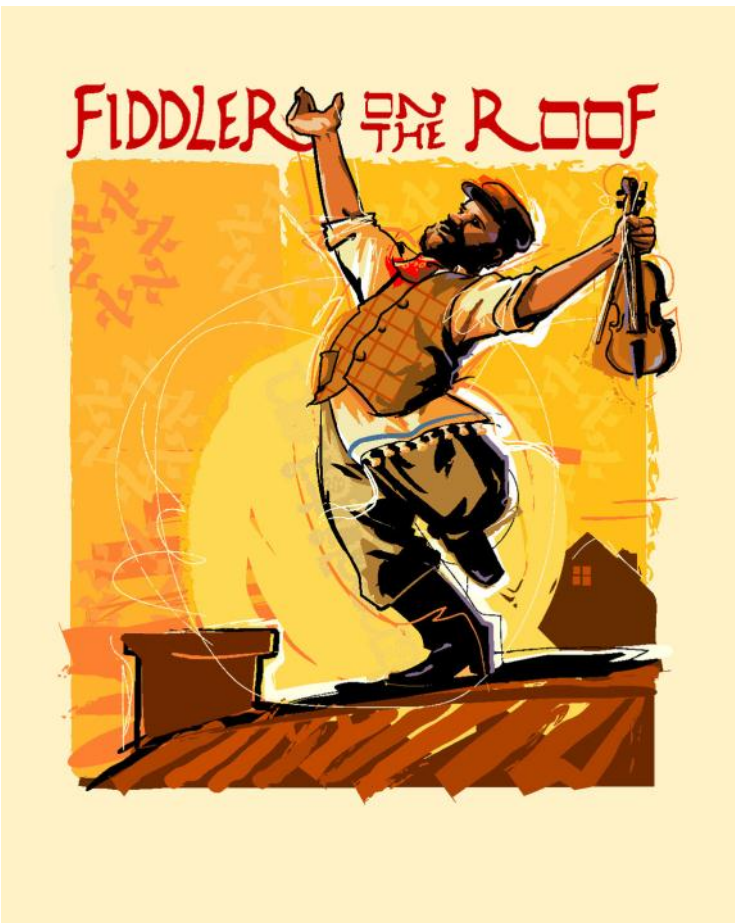
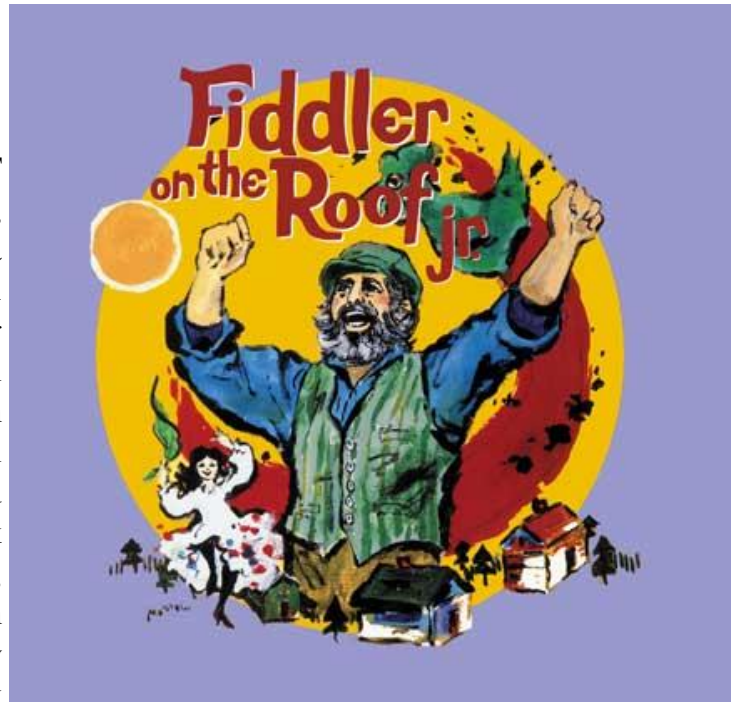
