## PARENT SURVEY – COST OF EDUCATION AND TUITION

“KML is becoming a rich kid’s school.” That statement and similar ones were shared by a few parents in last spring’s parent survey. It didn’t appear often, but it appeared often enough to address it as part of this newsletter series. Christian education at the secondary level is not inexpensive, and those who provide leadership in the area of school finances are well aware of that. They are working diligently at holding costs down while also supporting efforts to insure that our ministry continues to improve. The cost to educate one student for the 2011-12 school year is \$8,560. The following is the breakdown as to how that \$8,560 is covered:

Tuition – 72%

Congregational Support – 16%

KML Department Income – 10%

Individual Donors – 2%

There were also some concerns voiced on the survey about the impact of the PAC Project on tuition. Tuition has never supported or paid for capital projects and the accompanying debt. Capital projects are funded by offerings of individuals, congregations, and other income sources – such as grants. Tuition will be minimally impacted by the operating costs connected with the new facility – such as utilities and cleaning. Tuition will not be paying for the “brick and mortar” of the project, nor will it pay for the debt associated with the project.

We would echo what some parents shared in the survey, that they view their tuition dollars as an investment, not a cost. A “cost” brings no return; it is simply payment for a product or a service that has utility (gas for the car, heating the home, etc.). An investment brings return but not necessarily a financial return. Christian education at any level – including the high school level – will pay dividends and add value for years. We live in a time when Satan has a strong foothold in so much of our culture. Having our teens sitting at the feet of Jesus each and every day and using God’s Word in the countless situations that arise during the high school years, is invaluable to many parents.

## Chapel Auditorium Project Moves Forward



On November 28, the delegates of our twenty-eight churches voted to complete a ten year facility expansion vision and advance the mission of Kettle Moraine Lutheran High School. The historic "YES" vote to break ground on the Chapel Auditorium was made after measuring the obstacles of economy and debt, timing, and potential rising construction costs. Though divided on the earthly issues, the voting body united under the mission that launched KML decades ago. We continue to trust in a God who blesses the ministry at KML. The historic vote means that the KML Federation can break ground for the Chapel Auditorium as early as the spring of 2012. There is much that needs to be done before the actual ground breaking date is set including a plan to reduce the construction costs through a prioritization of needs and seeking gifts-in-kind donations of labor and materials from within the federation, and seeking additional gifts that reduce our need to borrow. ### **The vote was taken - what now?**

On November 28, the General Board voted to move ahead with plans to build a chapel/auditorium and fine arts academic wing. The vote reflected confidence that God will provide, but also recognized the concerns about the financial challenges. This short update explains the next steps in this process. There is a great deal of work that must be done before we can break ground. To make the project manageable we are working with the architect and builder to find ways in which the costs can be reduced. The Board of Directors is prioritizing some options. We are seeking gifts-in-kind from people who have the ability to donate labor or materials which ultimately reduces the overall costs. In addition, the Mission Advancement Team continues seeking new gifts and pledges that will decrease the amount we need to borrow. In summary, the approval on November 28 has authorized us to move forward with our plans, but we are being faithful and diligent throughout this process. We will not break ground until we are convinced that the facility plans are complete and the financing plan is acceptable.

### **Will this facility expansion affect tuition?**

Tuition pays for approximately 70% of the cost of education and maintenance at KML. Federation congregations and individual donors pay the balance plus pay for facility expansion and debt service. We have followed that practice during each of the last four facility expansions, and plan to do the same with this addition. Consistent with our past practice, families will not see an increase in tuition to pay for construction or debt service on this project. Since the addition will add to the size of the school and will result in additional utility and maintenance expenses, we anticipate a slight tuition increase to pay for those operational costs. KML's leaders are well aware that rising tuition is a concern and will continue the goal of offering quality Christian education at a reasonable cost.

### **Is this project too big?**

That question was never verbalized, but it might be a silent question on people's minds. There is no question that this project is big. Other WELS schools have larger fine arts facilities, but this is a major step for KML, and is certainly a big step for our Federation. But the question remains, "Is it too big?"

Superintendent Bartelt said it very well. This project is so big that only God can get the credit when it is accomplished. So, is this project big? Yes – most certainly! Is it too big? Not when we consider the words of Paul to the Ephesians, "*Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.*" – Ephesians 3:20-21.

## **WANTED! INCOMING FRESHMEN TO ENROLL IN COMPUTER APPLICATIONS BC!**

We are looking for students with basic word processing skills who can type 30-35 words a minute. You are *strongly encouraged* to “test out” of the freshman *Computer Applications AB* class – even if you are not sure how fast you can type. Students who test out will be enrolled in *Computer Applications BC*, a course that allows students to skip learning how to type and move right into more advanced word processing, spreadsheets and PowerPoint presentations.

#### Semester 1 - Part A

- \* basic keyboarding (learning to type)
- \* basic formatting of reports, letters, tables, etc.

#### Semester 2 - Part B

- \* basic word processing skills (Microsoft Word)
- \* basic spreadsheet skills (Microsoft Excel)
- \* basic presentation skills (Microsoft PowerPoint)

### **Computer Applications BC**

#### Semester 1 - Part B

- \* basic word processing skills, (Microsoft Word)
- \* basic spreadsheet skills (Microsoft Excel)
- \* basic presentation skills (Microsoft Power Point)

#### Semester 2 - Part C

- \* advanced word processing skills (Microsoft Word LibreOffice Writer 3 and Google Docs)
- \* advanced spreadsheet skills (Microsoft Excel, LibreOffice.org Calc 3 and Google Docs)

All testing will take place at KML. Students should plan to be here for approximately 45 minutes. The assessment will include: basic word processing of paragraphs, technique evaluation and 3-minute timed writings. The testing will take place during the month of March. Pre-registration for the upcoming freshman class took place on December 5 and December 8. We are thankful that 109 students are signed up for the class of 2016. The Lord certainly continues to bless the ministry of KML!

## **ACT PREP CLASS**

We will again sponsor an ACT prep class at KML starting February 20. The fee for this class is \$140. Juniors will receive further details about the class when they have their individual conferences with Mr. Sievert and Mr. Zeamer.



## **COLLEGE APPLICATIONS**

Seniors should plan to submit their college applications in the very near future, if they have not already done so. Many colleges close their application window as early as February 1.
