If you are ordering school pictures, it is the student's responsibility to bring money and the picture envelope the first day of school. ### STUDENTS AFTER SCHOOL POLICY

Due to longer distances, schedules, and carpools, some of our students who aren't in an after school activity find it necessary to stay after school to wait for a ride; sometimes the wait is quite long. We do understand that at times this can't be helped, yet we are asking families to make every effort to make arrangements to have their children picked up from school as soon as possible. ## POSTER DESIGN CONTEST

### BACKGROUND:

Imagine someone playing a fiddle while at the same time maintaining his balance, standing precariously on a roof. The fiddler on the roof represents the Jewish people desperately trying to maintain their identity. This becomes increasingly more difficult as the new generations reject traditions that define them. As quoted in the first number of the show, without their Russian Jewish traditions, their lives would be as shaky as "a fiddler on the roof!"

*Fiddler on the Roof* is a musical with music by Jerry Bock, lyrics by Sheldon Harnick, and book by Joseph Stein, set in Tsarist Russia in 1905. It is based on *Tevye and his Daughters* (or *Tevye the Milkman and Other Tales*) by Sholem Aleichem. The story centers on Tevye, the father of five daughters, and his attempts to maintain his family traditions while outside influences encroach upon their lives. He must cope with both the strong-willed actions of his three older daughters—each one's choice of husband moves further away from the customs of her faith—and with the edict of the Tsar that evicts the Jewish people from their village.

## ADVERTISING YOUR BUSINESS

## SIGN UP FOR ALERTNOW!

If your child participates in athletics, it is very important that you are part of the AlertNow database. Using AlertNow, the athletic office can send text messages, e-mails, and phone calls to report cancellations, postponements, rescheduled contests, etc. Sign up by logging into PowerSchool and clicking on the AlertNow icon.

## REQUIRED ATHLETIC FORMS

Students who will be participating in sports need the following information turned in to the athletic office by August 1. Forms may be mailed in or dropped off in the main office.

- 1) Participation Consent Form (yellow) - This is needed by all students participating in athletics
- 2) WIAA Physical Form (green) - Incoming freshmen and juniors typically need this form (good for 2 years); it needs to be signed by the doctor and filled out completely and signed by the parent
- 3) WIAA Alternate Form (beige) - sophomores and seniors typically need this form, It needs to be filled out completely and signed by the parent.

**Forms for all athletes need to be on file by August 1. Athletes will not be allowed to try out or practice for a team if they do not have forms handed in!**

## SPORTS FEE

The Board of Directors has established an athletic participation fee to help defray transportation expenses. The fee is \$40 for soccer, volleyball, basketball, cheerleading (per season), and dance and \$60 for football. In lieu of charging admissions to regular season home events, the participation fee for all other sports is set at \$50. Billing for these fees will be done after teams have been selected and will be added to your fiscal statement.

## EQUIPMENT AND UNIFORMS

Athletes are issued uniforms at the beginning of each sports season. The proper care of them is the duty of the athlete. **Uniforms should never be bleached.** Any equipment or uniform lost or damaged, beyond common use, must be replaced by the athlete. The cost will be based on the replacement price. **Cleaned uniforms are due to the coach or athletic office within one week of the teams' final season game for each athlete.** Late fees of \$5.00 per week will be assessed up to a month, after which a replacement fee will be enforced. Uniforms need to be handed in to the athletic office in a bag with your name included. Please make sure that the uniform is cleaned, turned right-side out, and complete. Needed repairs should be made if possible. If you have any questions, call the athletic office, 262-677-4051, ext. 1103.

## TEAM PICTURES AND PHOTO BUTTONS
