PERFECT TIMING

It's interesting that we don't know for sure the exact date of Jesus' birth, yet we know it was perfect timing. Why? The Apostle Paul wrote, *When the time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under law, to redeem those under law, that we might receive the full rights of sons.* (Galatians 4:4-5). Jesus' birth – a quiet moment, virtually unnoticed by the world – combined with his perfect life, suffering, death and resurrection, was the most important event in this world's history. HAZARDOUS WEATHER

Please listen to the radio and TV or check websites for any announcements about school closings or late starts. Because the public school districts provide busing for many of our students, whenever the public schools in West Bend close, KML will also close. We will make announcements about closings and late starts as early as possible and you will be notified through the *Power Announcement* communication system.

If weather conditions change drastically for the worse during the school day, the administration of KML will attempt to get buses to pick our students up earlier than the regular dismissal time. This is not always possible if the bus companies are not be able to find drivers. Students who drive to school will be allowed to leave **ONLY AFTER PARENTS CALL THE SCHOOL** requesting that their child be allowed to leave early. If the decision is made to close school early, the media groups listed above will be contacted and an announcement will be made.

Weather and road conditions can vary greatly from one end of the federation to another. Parents, if you haven't heard a "late start" or a "closing" announcement before school, use your judgment in making a decision. The same holds true when deciding whether or not to have your child leave school early to go home. In any case, when there is no school-wide announcement, the decision is yours.

NEW INTERNATIONAL STUDENT PROGRAM COORDINATOR

Her position is funded from the tuition paid by our international students. The KML Scrip office is gearing up for a busy holiday season. Whether you use scrip to purchase gifts or buy the scrip cards as gifts, KML Scrip is your one-stop shop.

As you make your list and check it twice, here are some tips to make shopping with KML Scrip easy:

- Order early. To guarantee the scrip you want will be here by Christmas, have your order into the KML Scrip Office by midnight Thursday, December 13.
- Order online. ScripNow is the fastest and easiest way to purchase KML Scrip. Purchase scrip online and print it at home. See the sidebar for more tips on using ScripNow.
- Plan ahead for large quantities. If you intend to buy more than five of one particular card, order early. While we have a lot of scrip cards on hand, ordering ahead or letting the Scrip office know will make sure your cards are here when you need them.
- Shopping last minute? The KML Scrip Office will be open Friday, December 21, 9:00am—1:00pm for on-hand purchases.
- Don't forget your regular purchases! The KML Scrip Office will be closed December 22-January 3. Plan ahead for gas and grocery purchases!
