ROAD CONSTRUCTION / ACCESS TO KML

The best alternative route would be to take Sherman Road (just south of KML) to our gravel driveway on Sherman Rd or continue on to Highway G and go north a short distance to KML. Due to longer distances, schedules, and carpools, some of our students who aren't in an after school activity find it necessary to stay after school to wait for a ride. We understand this can't be helped at times, yet we are asking families to make every effort to arrange to have their children picked up from school as early as possible. Students who have a legitimate need to be on campus after school must stay in the cafeteria and display appropriate behavior. Students who do not abide by the after school guidelines will not be allowed to remain on campus after school, and the families will need to make other plans.

TEXTBOOK CARE

It is important that students take good care of their textbooks so that they remain in good condition for as long as possible and so students can avoid fines for damages and losses. The following is a summary of how textbooks are managed, how fines are assessed, and some of the rationale for the fines:

- * At the beginning of the year, textbooks are handed out to the students in their classes. Any damage to the book done by previous owners is recorded in the bookstore database. Students will be able to see what damage is already recorded for their books, and have the opportunity to report any "new" damage they find to their instructor so they do not get charged for it at the end of the year. Students have until September 5 to report damage to their teacher. After that date, any damage found to the book at the end of the term will be the responsibility of the student/parent. Be advised that KML does not charge fines or record damage for normal wear and light, incidental marks or tears.
- * Students are required to put book covers on each textbook (English novels and paperbacks are exempt). There is a \$2 fine per book per day if this is not done. Teachers now have the ability to immediately charge students for missing book covers, so expect this requirement to be enforced more this year than it has in the past. The "stretchy" cloth book covers are recommended, but be advised that some have been known to stain books (which would result in a fine). Free paper book covers are available in the library every day.
- * Most damage tends to come from students throwing books, tossing their backpacks onto tables and floors, and from standing books upright in the bottom section of the locker. Also, storing an excessive amount of papers in a book does a great deal of damage to the binding. To prevent damage, keep books covered and away from liquids, rain, and snow. Store books flat in the top part of the locker, and use binders or folders to hold papers.
- * If a textbook is lost, the student must pay the full replacement value regardless of the age or condition of the book. If a student damages a book so it becomes unusable (water damage, broken binding, etc.), the student will also be charged the full replacement value of the book.

When our school finishes using a textbook, we sell them to used book companies. These companies are very selective about what they purchase from us (they won't buy back a book with a frayed cover or any water damage). Since we try to keep current with textbooks for educational reasons, it is important to gain as much back as possible from the resale so that we can use those funds to help purchase new books. The funds gained from resale of old textbooks allows for less to be added to the budget which impacts tuition costs.

Please be diligent in helping your student record and communicate damage to their teachers by September 5. Help insure that books are covered and please encourage responsible care of the books.



KML SCHOOLS CONFERENCE

The teachers of the schools in the KML Federation from preschool through high school had a conference on Monday, August 6 at KML. One of the purposes of the conference was spiritual growth as KML Pastor Berger led a Bible study on *The Partnerships We Share in Ministry*. The KML Schools' teachers also grew professionally as they completed a professional learning community exercise. Through this exercise they shared resources, discussed challenges for their students and brain-stormed ways to meet in the future by grade level across the federation. Moving forward as a professional learning community has meeting students' needs a high priority.

The conference also had a focus on Physical Education instruction improvement. Martin Luther College Professor John Gronholz and KML's Todd Jahns led hands-on workshops on the *Spark* Physical Education curriculum. It was a kick start to an improved physical education curriculum that is unified in many of our KML Schools. Todd Jahns will also be used as a federation physical education resource person--leading our schools in purchasing options, tag-teaching, and giving other assistance where necessary. The KML Schools teachers also enjoyed fellowship time to refocus as they enter another school year—a school year where our KML Schools educate, encourage, and equip students for life and for eternity.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT TEST RESULTS

A total of 36 students wrote 53 Advanced Placement (AP) tests at the end of the 2011-12 school year. Tests were written in these subject areas: Music Theory, English Language/Composition, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Chemistry, Environmental Science, German Language, and Spanish Language. Our students earned these scores (on a scale of 1-5).

AP Score	1	2	3	4	5
Number of Students	8	12	16	9	8

Typically, colleges will award college credit to students who have earned grades of "4" or "5." Colleges may award credit for grades of "3" as well.

PARENT-TEACHER CONSULTATIONS

Our parent-teacher consultation day format has been changed. Consultations for parents of students in grades 9 and 10 will take place Wednesday, September 26 and Tuesday, October 2. The consultations will be held from 6:00-8:30pm on both dates. Consultations for parents of juniors and seniors will take place on Wednesday, November 7 from 6:00-8:30pm. Watch for a mailing that will be sent in early September that explains more fully the rationale for the change.

Our annual Charity Golf Outing and Dinner is scheduled for Monday, September 17, and will be held at the prestigious West Bend Country Club. This event is filled with wonderful golf, meals and fellowship, and is a great way to support the ministry of KML and the KML Foundation.

TECHNOLOGY INFORMATION

NEW NOTIFICATION SYSTEM – POWER ANNOUNCEMENT

KML will be using a new automated notification system this year, called Power Announcement. This replaces the AlertNow system that we used previously. Power Announcement will be used by KML to notify parents via phone, text message, and email about emergencies, school closings, general school announcements, activity cancellations, postponements, and rescheduled contests. Parents should check that their contact information and preferences are correct by logging in to their PowerSchool accounts at ps.kmlhs.org and then clicking on the Power Announcement icon. DO YOU FILTER INTERNET ACCESS?

Students at KML browse the Internet through a multi-tiered filtering system that helps to protect them from inappropriate content and to protect the KML network from malicious software. One of the tools that we use is called OpenDNS. This service is available free for home use. Implementing OpenDNS on a home network usually takes only a few minutes and will protect all of the devices in your house that use your Internet connection including desktop computers, laptops, tablets, iPods, and video game systems. To start using OpenDNS, go to <http://store.opendns.com>, create an account, and then follow the instruction to “Change DNS on your: Router.” If you need assistance with OpenDNS, we suggest that you visit <http://www.opendns.com/support>.

ONLINE LUNCH DEPOSITS

KML is pleased to introduce a new program called e-Funds for Schools. This program offers various options for parents to make lunch deposits electronically from a checking account or charged to a credit/debit card. There is a \$1.00 transaction convenience fee for each electronic checking payment that you make. For payments made by credit or debit card, there is a convenience fee of \$2.45 per each \$100 increment in the transaction. When you set up your account please review your options carefully. You are in full control of your account and can make a payment at any time that is convenient for you. No payments will be allowed without your knowledge and authorization through this secure payment system. By providing your home and/or work email address, an email notification informing you of the student's name, purpose of the payment, and the amount of the item will be sent to you each time that a payment is to be processed. The e-Funds for Schools site is secure and uses industry standard data encryption. Access the payment site and information about registering for e-Funds for Schools at www.kmlhs.org/efunds. You will need your student's ID number to sign up for e-Funds. The ID number is printed on report cards and billing statements. BYOT – BRING YOUR OWN TECHNOLOGY

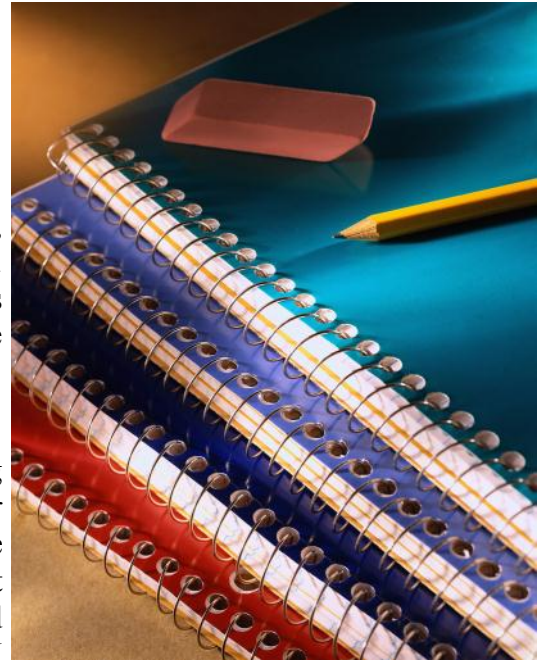
Portable Internet-connected devices like iPads, tablets, laptops, netbooks, and smart phones are becoming more and more common place among high school aged students. In an effort to capitalize on this technology for educational purposes, KML has determined that we will spend this school year evaluating the potential of the Bring Your Own Technology (BYOT) concept. In a BYOT school, students are encouraged to bring their own technology devices to the classroom for course work and are provided access to the Internet through the school's wireless network. Each teacher will then have their own policies for acceptable use of those devices in the classroom. This will be a learning experience for both students and teachers as we explore the benefits and challenges that BYOT presents. It is **not** a requirement that every student have or bring a device to school. KML has also added four new mobile wireless device labs for teachers to use in their classrooms in order to provide additional resources for expanding classroom technology use.
