The fee is \$50 for soccer, volleyball, basketball, cheerleading (per season), and dance and \$75 for football. In lieu of charging admissions to regular season home events for all other sports the participation fee is set at \$60. Billing for these fees will be done after teams have been selected and will be added to your fiscal statement.

ATHLETES, THESE FORMS ARE REQUIRED!

Athletes who will be participating in sports need the following paperwork turned in to the athletic office by **August 1**. Forms may be mailed or dropped off in the main office.

- 1) Participation Consent Form (yellow) - this is needed by all students participating in athletics
- 2) WIAA Physical Form (green) - incoming freshmen and juniors typically need this form (good for 2 years); it needs to be signed by the doctor and filled out completely and signed by the parent
- 3) WIAA Alternate Form (beige) - sophomores and seniors typically need this form; it needs to be filled out completely and signed by the parent.
- 4) Parent & Athlete Concussion Agreement – read and signed by athlete and parent, needed for each sport season, each year

EQUIPMENT AND UNIFORMS

The proper care of that equipment is the duty of the athlete. **Uniforms should never be bleached.** Any equipment or uniform lost or damaged beyond common use must be replaced by the athlete. The cost will be based on the replacement price. **Cleaned uniforms are due to the coach or athletic office within one week after the teams' final season game for each individual athlete.** Late fees of \$5.00 per week will be assessed up to a month, after which a replacement fee will be assessed to the athlete. Uniforms need to be handed in to the athletic office in a bag with your name included. Please make sure that the uniform is cleaned, turned right-side out, and complete. Repairs should be made if possible. If you have any questions call the athletic office.
