KML SCHOOLS CONFERENCE

The schools of the KML Federation from grades preschool through grade 12 met for a KML Schools Conference on Tuesday, June 4. The day included several presenters known as experts in their fields. Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary Professor Paul Zell led the federation in a Bible study. The rest of the day was broken into rotating sectionals for teachers of grades PK-2, 3-6, and 7-12. Joshua Schoeneck led a sectional on how to use Google Drive and share ideas with parents, students, and other faculty members. Dr. Jason Lowery talked about the Common Core State Standards with an emphasis on using informational texts in the classroom. Finally, Martin Luther College Professors Jon Roux and Dr. Cindy Whaley led the groups in discussions about writing and the Writing Workshop in the classroom. Overall, the teachers of the federation had several opportunities to collaborate and share fresh ideas in the classroom for the school year to come.

FALL FOCUS DAY

Our Fall Focus Day will be held during the morning of Wednesday, October 16. This is a special day for our students as they focus on their future goals and opportunities. The freshman will hear a number of valuable presentations, the sophomores will take the PLAN test, and the juniors will take the PSAT. The seniors will have a new and unique opportunity that day. They will be directed to make college visits, arrange to job shadow, or do something else that is directly related to college admissions or learning about a career. Regardless of activity, the students are reminded that the Fall Concert is the evening of October 16, and participants must be back in time for the performance.



CHANGE FROM FISCAL OFFICE

The fiscal office will no longer be giving change to students. If students plan to use the vending machines after chapel, during lunch or after school, they will need to bring the proper change to school with them. Machines will accept \$1 and \$5 bills.

COUNSELING SERVICES AVAILABLE

We are pleased to share that counseling services remain available for KML students. This service is provided by Wisconsin Lutheran Child and Family Service (WLCFS) at no cost to the students' families or to KML. An anonymous donor has made this possible; Pastor of Student Life Randall Hughes will serve as the contact person for families desiring such services. COMMON CORE STATE STANDARDS

The KML faculty is in the middle of a year-long in-service study of the Literacy Standards of the Common Core and its application to the classroom. The overall goal of this in-service will be a systemized way to ensure improvement in each KML classroom. The in-services include "Why KML Schools Need Improvement," "Pathways to the Common Core," "Introduction to the Literacy Anchor Standards," "Aligning Departments," and a "Unit Design Workshop." The in-services have or will be led by KML Curriculum Coordinator James Carlovsky and Wisconsin Lutheran High School instructor Keith Bowe. The studies focus on the best learning practices of the Common Core and improving instruction in each class. The KML Math department has already aligned its curriculum to the Common Core Math standards.

PARENT/TEACHER CONSULTATION DAYS

Consultations for parents of students in grades 9 and 10 will take place Wednesday, September 25 and Tuesday, October 1. The consultations will be held from 6:00-8:30pm on both dates. Consultations for parents of juniors and seniors will take place on Wednesday, November 6 from 6:00-8:30pm. Parents, you are reminded and encouraged to contact your child's teachers with questions or concerns at any time.

SCHOLARSHIPS, ADMISSIONS COUNSELORS AND RECRUITERS

Students will be informed throughout the year when scholarship information becomes available or when a college or military representative is going to be on campus. Be sure to take advantage of these opportunities, and stop at the Student Services office for specific information.

TEACHER WEB PAGES

All teachers have a web page. At a minimum, teachers are to post their course syllabi. Many teachers post other helpful information as well. You will then see links to each teacher's page. Another way to access a teacher's web page is to put a back slash, followed by the teacher's last name after the school web address.

2012-13 TEXTBOOK FINES

Textbook fines from last school year were assessed and available for viewing on PowerSchool at the beginning of June but will not be charged onto student accounts until the September billing. If you would like to preview any possible fines, you can do the following:

- 1) Login to your PowerSchool parent account at ps.kmlhs.org
- 2) Click the Payments icon.
- 3) Click the Book fines link.

Please include the name of the student and the book/class of the disputed fine and it will be checked as soon as possible. Changes to fines will be made on the October statements if not sooner.

STUDENTS AFTER SCHOOL

Due to longer distances, schedules, and carpools, some of our students who aren't in an after school activity find it necessary to stay after school to wait for a ride. We understand this can't be helped at times, yet we are asking families to make every effort to arrange to have their children picked up from school as early as possible. Students who have a legitimate need to be on campus after school must stay in the cafeteria and display appropriate behavior. Students who do not abide by the after-school guidelines will not be allowed to remain on campus after school, and the families will need to make other plans.

TEXTBOOK CARE

It is important that students take good care of their textbooks so that they remain in good condition for as long as possible and so students can avoid fines for damages and losses. The following is a summary of how textbooks are managed, how fines are assessed, and some of the rationale for the fines:

- * At the beginning of the year, textbooks are handed out to the students in their classes. Any damage to the book done by previous owners is recorded in the bookstore database. Students will be able to see what damage is already recorded for their books and have the opportunity to report any "new" damage they find to their instructor so they do not get charged for it at the end of the year. Students have until August 30 to report damage to their teacher. After that date, any damage found to the book at the end of the term will be the responsibility of the student/parent. Be advised that KML does not charge fines or record damage for normal wear and light, incidental marks or tears.
- * Students are required to put book covers on each textbook (English novels and paperbacks are exempt). There is a \$2 fine per book per day if this is not done. Teachers now have the ability to immediately charge students for missing book covers, so expect this requirement to be enforced more this year than it has in the past. The "stretchy" cloth book covers are recommended, but be advised that some have been known to stain books (which would result in a fine). Free paper book covers are available in the library every day.
- * Most damage tends to come from students throwing books, tossing their backpacks onto tables and floors, and from standing books upright in the bottom section of the locker. Also, storing an excessive amount of papers in a book does a great deal of damage to the binding. To prevent damage, keep books covered and away from liquids, rain, and snow. Store books flat in the top part of the locker, and use binders or folders to hold papers.
- * If a textbook is lost, the student must pay the full replacement value regardless of the age or condition of the book. If a student damages a book so it becomes unusable (water damage, broken binding, etc.), the student will also be charged the full replacement value of the book.

When our school finishes using a textbook, we sell them to used book companies. These companies are very selective about what they purchase from us (they won't buy back a book with a frayed cover or any water damage). Since we try to keep current with textbooks for educational reasons, it is important to gain as much back as possible from the resale so that we can use those funds to help purchase new books. The funds gained from resale of old textbooks allows for less to be added to the budget which impacts tuition costs.

Please be diligent in helping your student record and communicate damage to their teachers by August 30. Help insure that books are covered and please encourage responsible care of the books.

KML will again be using Power Announcement to notify parents via phone, text message, and email about emergencies, school closings, general school announcements, activity cancellations, postponements, and rescheduled contests. 
EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION
